The Canadian Film Institute created the Latin American Film Festival in 1997. Our goal was and still is to increase the awareness, appreciation, and understanding of the cinemas of Latin America in Canada's capital. Over the first 19 years of programming and organizing this public festival, in collaboration with our generous partners at the GRULA (the group of Latin American embassies accredited by the Government of Canada), we have presented 251 Ottawa premieres of Latin American films, 22 visiting filmmakers, and have attracted close to 56,000 spectators.

cclaimed documentary filmmaker Fernando Molnar's first foray into fiction films is an offbeat, absurdist dark comedy that revolves around a determined (perhaps even a little delusional) character named Diego. Diego and his family have suffered in the economic downturn and live in the Delta de Tigre area outside his beloved capital city, Buenos Aires.

Absolutely committed to returning to the capital, Diego commutes to Buenos Aires, and gets a job selling upscale real estate in the showroom of a new building. He soon grows obsessed with the luxury of the showroom itself and makes a bold life decision. SHOWROOM is a quirky fable of modern alienation, the trials of economic uncertainty, and the strange relationship between form and function, fiction and reality. Starring Diego Peretti. n 2005, Michaëlle Jean became Governor General of Canada and made history by doing so. Not only is she the first black woman to occupy Canada's highest office, she also redefined the role. Actively engaged in social issues and a citizen of the world, Jean made her convictions clear—using the arts as a tool for social change, encouraging the voices of people in excluded and marginalized communities, defending the rights of women and indigenous people, and bringing a message of hope. Jean was also deeply affected on a personal level by the terrible earthquake that ravaged her native land of Haiti during the last moments of her term. This intimate documentary portrait, culled from more than 600 hours of footage, recounts her remarkable journey. The film's director, and former Honorary President of the Latin American Film Festival, Mr. Jean-Daniel Lafond, will attend the screening to introduce and discuss his film. 

MERCEDES ARIAS, DELFINA VIDAL / 2015 / 72 min.

his carefully researched documentary tells the story of Panama's long and fraught relationship with the United States of America by focusing on a cache of recently discovered letters written by the men who actually built the Canal, describing brutal working conditions, rampant disease and discrimination, as well as enduring hopes and fascinating anecdotes. BOX 25 makes elegant use of archival documents, photographs and films, as well as contemporary interviews, bringing these lost voices back to life, and is a vivid, sometimes poignant reminder of the complexities of history — personal, national and international — within which the Panama Canal was constructed. A perfect complement film to last year's LAFF opening night feature fiction film, PANAMA CANAL STORIES. English sub-titles.

he first fiction film from El Salvador to see a worldwide release, CROW'S NEST follows Don Cleo, a humble piñata salesman who receives an extortion letter at his doorstep. If he doesn't pay \$500, a small fortune for him, within 72 hours, he will be killed. Don Cleo quickly decides to gather the money through friends, but the harder he tries to raise the funds, the deeper into trouble he gets. If Don Cleo hopes to survive, he'll have to face his fears and stand up to his tormentors. Shot on location in neighbourhoods controlled by gangs, the script is based on a collection of real stories. Menéndez depicts a unique and realistic vision of El Salvador, where evangelical churches, reverence for the concept of the American Dream, a local struggling economy, and violence are juxtaposed in the everyday lives of some of El Salvador's most vulnerable people. layed to grizzled perfection by Colombian screen star Marlon Moreno, Manrique is a rather solitary man whose work involves watching over an abandoned salt mine located in a remote, ruggedly beautiful part of the Colombian Caribbean. His only companion is a strange dog who crazily chases fireflies all night. Manrique is disconnected from a world he claims to care nothing about, and is content in his isolation, that is, until the unexpected appearance of a young woman, who just happens to be Manrique's long lost teenage daughter. Her arrival changes everything. Gorgeously shot and filled with insight and humour, CHASING FIREFLIES is a moving story about the search to recover the joy of being alive. English sub-titles.

his enjoyable, kinetic comedy revolves around a group of friends who, tired of going to job interviews and never being hired, decide to start their own makeshift company offering 'diverse services.' They are willing to take on any type of job as long as they can scratch together an income from it. Opportunities do arrive, but are they ready for them? The services they suddenly must provide include specialized entertainment for children, dangerous bus driving assignments, and even the staging of exotic erotic dancing. The results are varying degrees of embarrassment and compromised dignity, struggle and sacrifice, and absolute hilarity! According to the film's producers, the Spanish title is based on a typical expression Hondurans use when applying for a job. Delightful comedy. English sub-titles.

Now, both of them have to adapt to each other; Armando to the unknown world of his gay father; Diego, to the closed attitude of his partner's moody teenage son. THE GOLDEN DREAM / LA JAULA DE ORO

DIEGO QUEMADA-DÍEZ / MEXICO, SPAIN / 2013 / 110 min.



This tough, absorbing, suspenseful drama follows three Guatemalan youths trying illegally to cross the Mexican border into the United States. Juan and Sara, two kids who are desperate to get out of Guatemala, along with a young Indian boy they meet, Chauk, head north together. With some US dollar bills sewn into their jeans, they plan on hopping boxcars and riding the rails through Mexico and into California, this last part requiring them to work their passage by volunteering as drug mules for the gangs running heroin. At every stage, these vulnerable teenagers face danger. DREAM is the winner of over 80 international awards. English sub-titles.

PANEL DISCUSSION: MIGRATION AND THE POLITICS OF MOBILITY

This panel will explore the political, economic and social factors driving migration from Central America, including the dangerous path northwards through Mexico on the now-infamous train, La Bestia. The panel will also address human rights and security issues and what can be done to help mitigate this difficult situation.

Laura Macdonald is a professor of Political Science and Political Economy at Carleton University, with a focus on Latin American politics.

Victoria Simmons is a PhD Candidate in Sociology at Carleton University completing her doctoral dissertation on the politics of mobility on the train known as La Bestia.

Ashley Armstrong is the Online Media & Outreach Coordinator (Acting) with the Nobel Women's Initiative, which uses the prestige of the Nobel Peace Prize and of courageous women peace laureates to magnify the power and visibility of women working in countries around the world for peace, justice and equality.

GHOST TOWN TO HAVANA

Two teams. Two countries. One game. Filmmaker Eugene Corr spends five years on ball fields in inner city Oakland and in Havana, following the lives of two extraordinary youth baseball coaches: Nicolas Reyes, year-old Afro-Cuban coaches in a Havana neighbourhood rich in community but struggling economically, and Roscoe Bryant, a 46 year-old African-American man who coaches in a troubled Oakland neighbourhood wracked by three decades of gang violence. The filmmaker introduces the coaches on videotape. Coach Roscoe vows he will take his players to Cuba to play Nicolas's team one day. Plans are



THE PEARL BUTTON / EL BOTÓN DE NÁCAR

PATRICIO GUZMÁN / CHILE, FRANCE, SPAIN / 2015 / 82 min.



Legendary Chilean filmmaker Patricio Guzmán (THE BATTLE OF CHILE. NOSTALGIA FOR THE LIGHT delivers another astonishing achievement with THE PEARL BUTTON. Taking water as its central metaphor, the film assembles a stream of recollections and poetic reflections about ancient and contemporary Chilean history. With breathtaking visuals, Guzmán examines the near-extermination of the indigenous people of Chilean Patagonia, Kaweskar ('Water People'), at the hands of European colonial forces from the north. For centuries, the Kaweskar lived along Chile's nearly 4,000 kilometres of coastline in harmony with nature; when European colonizers arrived, their world and their pantheist pacifism were soon

utterly decimated. Merging interviews with some of the last remaining survivors, archival footage, and striking natural imagery, THE PEARL BUTTON is a meditation on memory, identity, and the recurring patterns of human 'disappearance' in Chile across its tangled past as a nation. As the train makes its way, they are attacked by enraged townspeople and deceived in ways that will change not only their lives but also the life of their country. English sub-titles.

onique (Sanaa Alaoui) is a Parisian in her mid-thirties. She has never met her Cuban father. One morning in a Paris airport, waiting to fly to Havana to finally meet her father, she meets Mario (singer Paulo Fernandez Gallo, or FG), a Cuban photojournalist in his 50s. Both are supposed to take the same flight to Cuba, but all flights are cancelled due to weather conditions. Stranded at an airport hotel, between confessions and a growing attraction, these two fast friends share their points of view about Cuba by discussing their histories, their doubts and hopes, and their views on Cuba. In their brief encounter, Monique and Mario undertake a journey into themselves, and a journey into the complexities of Cuba and Cuban identity. They also just might be falling in love. eet the indomitable Maikol Yordan Soto. A humble, innocent, kindhearted Costa Rican farmer, who, after failing to get a job in the city, is advised to go back home to the farm. Upon his return his grandmother tells him that they owe a large sum of money to the bank for the farm and that a businessman is ready to pounce on their land for a development project. Now faced with the prospects of losing his farm, Maikol embarks in an unlikely journey to Europe to raise enough money to pay the debts meeting new acquaintances, lost relatives and himself. It is, as you will discover, an unforgettable trip. This uproarious comedy holds the record for being the biggest box office hit in the history of Costa Rican cinema. English sub-titles.

An absorbing Dominican Republican variation on the 'prodigal son' story, THE REYNA FAMILY is both a family drama and an entertaining and moving story of love and forgiveness. Shot in El Valle Constanza, the film boasts an impressive array of prominent actors, including David Maler and Danilo Reynoso, as well as the special participation of Cuquín Victoria, Adalgisa Pantaleon, Evelyna Rodriguez, and Carasaf Sanchez. his well-observed first feature film chronicles a rainy vacation taken by Alberto, a divorced Uruguayan father, and his two kids. Deceptively simple, WATER is a fascinating portrait of the three-way interaction among a firm but loving dad, his rebellious teen daughter, Lucia, and her kid brother, Fede. It's raining nonstop before they've even arrived at the spartan bungalow where they'll be spending the week. During the long trip by car and the first hours at the somewhat rundown resort, it's clear that both kids would rather be elsewhere. Much to their dismay, their cabin hasn't got a TV, and even the pool can't be used due to an oncoming electric storm. Soon enough, however, things begin to improve for all three of them in different and amusing ways. SO MUCH WATER won top prize at the 30th Miami International Film Festival. English sub-titles.

GUATAMALA

FRI./VEN. MAY 13 MAI, 19:00

JAYRO BUSTAMANTE / 2015 / 91 min.

his brilliant debut feature is a stunning fusion of fact and fable, a dreamlike evocation of the daily lives of Kaqchikel-speaking Mayans on a coffee plantation at the base of an active volcano. Immersing us in its Mayan characters' customs and beliefs, IXCANUL chronicles a people and a culture in grave danger of disappearing. But it is also a love story. Seventeen-year-old María and her family harvest coffee beans for Spanish-speaking foreman Ignacio, to whom the family has promised María as his future wife. María, however, is attracted to a young coffee picker named Pepe, who dreams of escaping the plantation and travelling to 'the other side of the volcano' and freedom: the United States of America. When María and Pepe come together late one evening, their union will change their lives forever, and it will set them on a journey from which there is no turning back. Stunning. ECUADOR

aime Roldós's brief stay in government as Ecuador's president ended abruptly in 1981 after a suspicious airplane crash. His tragic destiny is the starting point of this intense documentary that combines investigative journalism, cinematographic essay, and personal drama in order to investigate the 'official' story. When the plane carrying the Ecuadorian president Jaime Roldós's crashed into the mountain of Huayrapungo, killing all passengers, it was deemed after just one week to be an accident. But was it? For seven years, Rivera and Sarmiento did exhaustive research of archival material and conducted interviews with Roldós's children and friends, trying to get the real story, as well as to revitalize the collective memory of an incident that shook Ecuador, and delayed the country's return to democracy. PERU

SALVADOR DEL SOLAR / 2015 / 109 min.

n aged Peruvian taxi driver named Magallanes, formerly an aide to a military officer in the bloodiest days of government repression during the Shining Path insurgency, re-encounters a young indigenous woman who had been victimized by his superior. Magallanes supplements his meagre earnings with a job taking an old man out on daily excursions.

The old man is now senile and frail, but he was once a much-feared Colonel in the Peruvian military, and Magallanes's boss. One day a woman named Celina gets in Magallanes' cab. Celina doesn't recognize Magallanes, but he remembers her. Many years ago, she was kidnapped and held captive in a hotel room for an entire year by that very same Colonel. Magallanes has a photograph to prove this — a photo he can use to blackmail the Colonel's affluent son. But can he suddenly transform himself into an extortionist?
